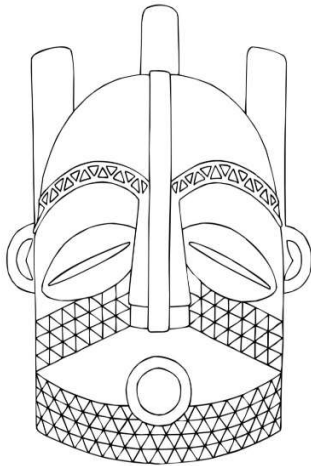


AFRICA

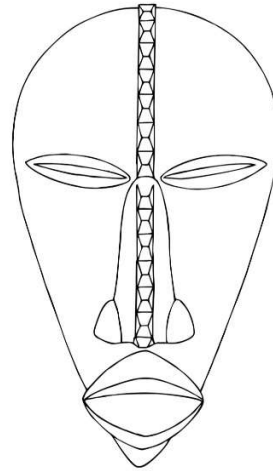
Africa is the second largest continent in the world.

BIOMBO MASK

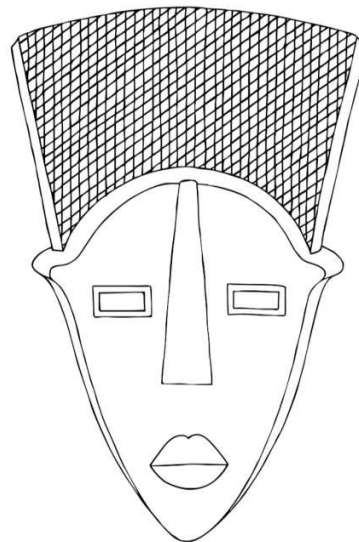
